Atrapallada focuses largely on dishes from Spain's rugged northwestern coast of Galicia. It's beautifully designed in cool woods with quirky design features and comes across as a contemporary restaurant that also serves tapas.



Pulpo a la Gallega [octopus dusted with paprika, Galicia style] is amazingly tender, served with potatoes for extra bite. Zamburinas are small scallops served in their shell under a gorgeous white wine sauce topped with diced jamon. Iberian surf and turf doesn't get any better.
